


Interviews with 802 registered U.S. voters, conducted online July 7-10, 2025.

Thinking now about immigrants, that is, people who come from other countries to live here in the United States, in your view, should immigration be kept at its present level, increased, or decreased?








Rising support for allowing undocumented immigrants to stay if requirements met

Which comes closer to your view about how to handle undocumented immigrants who are now living in the United States?








Where voters think immigration arrests should – and should not – be allowed.

No, this should not be allowed Yes, this should be allowed








Voters oppose Trump administration policy allowing enforcement in hospitals and other healthcare facilities.
